Rocs Drop Two in Double Header

he first week of Spring League 2010 is underway. The Ragna Rocs (Captains: off the season by dropping to 0-2 after their double header on Saturday, April 3rd against the Victorian Violins (Captains: Erik and Cristine) and the Easy-Bake Ovens (Captains: Brandon and Melanie).

The Violins orchestrated an amazing performance, finishing off the Rocs (300-84) in less than an hour (including timeouts). Violins took care of business, scoring 27 goals and 15 hits. Dao led the way for the Violins with a total of 11 goals, followed by Andrew and Cristine with 8 goals each. Not to be outdone. Erik and

William (Violin beaters) allowed only 2 hits while combining for a total of 15 hits (Erik-6, Grace and Jennifer) start William-9), knocking out their opposing beaters (Chris and Kyler) once each. The real game changer however was the miraculous Violin's keeper, Jayson. Blocking 17/25 shots (68%), minimizing the Rocs to a mere 8 goals.

> Marisa played a solid game in her keeping debut, blocking 5/19 shots (26%). Jason stepped in for Marisa halfway through, blocking 7/19 shots (37%).

Immediately following Saturday afternoon's game the Rocs gave a great performance against the Ovens but resulted in another loss (176-308).

The Rocs chased extremely well, out reaching the Ovens 35 to 28. Cristina led the way for the Rocs scoring 10 goals, followed by Grace-4, and Jennifer-3. The Rocs had more possessions off of reaches, but the Oven's were able to steal a combined total of 14 times, limiting the number of shots for the Rocs.

Brandon led the charge in chasing with a whopping 15 goals, closely followed by teammates Amy-11, and next week's games, the Melanie-1. Chris and Marisa struggled to find their rythmn, allowing-Timothy and Ashlev to dominate beating, combining for a total of 19 hits (Timothy-14, Ash-

ley-5).

The Ovens keeping struggled early on with Sujeevan blocking only 1/14 (7.14%) but the Rocs were not able to capitalize, only shooting a total of 18 times. Robyn later replaced Sujeevan, blocking 2/3 shots (66.67%).

The Rocs took two hard losses, but they played both games without their star chaser and 1st overall draft pick, (Jamie).

Looking ahead to Rocs hope to improve their record this Saturday, April 10th, at 5pm EST against the Violins. Sunday's game is a matchup of the Ovens and Violins at 5pm EST.
